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Performance Notes.

General

- Notation is proportional and is to be performed in relation to the bracketed durations which appear above each system.
- Dashed vertical lines are used to synchronise events within the pieces.
- Accidentals only apply to notes they immediately precede, and notes directly repeated.
- Demisemiquaver acciaccaturas are to be performed as fast as possible.

Harpsichord

Percussion

- The top layer of strings are to be covered with a cloth in such a way that when that stop is heard independently, the only sound that is emitted from the instrument is a pitched dead pluck.
- The stops are to be controlled by a second auxiliary performer. + refers to the muted stop, **o** refers to the open stop.
- Amplification is to be placed in such a way that captures and amplifies the resonance and attack of the dampened stop. The amplification should also pick up the percussive hitting on the body of the harpsichord.

Setup:

- Crotales
- Splash Cymbal (muted)
- 2 Wood Blocks
- 3 Tom-toms (muted)
- Bass Drum (muted with metal chains on the skin)
